# Criminology



## <u>Type of course – A Level</u>

### **Course Overview**

An understanding of criminology is relevant to many job roles within the criminal justice sector, social and probation work and sociology and psychology. WJEC Level 3 Diploma in Criminology is a qualification with elements of psychology, Law and Sociology that complements studies in humanities.

## **Course Content**

The first mandatory unit will enable the students to demonstrate understanding of different types of crime, influences on perceptions of crime and why some crimes are unreported. The second mandatory unit will allow students to gain an understanding of why people commit crime, drawing on what they have learned in unit 1. The third mandatory unit will provide an understanding of the criminal justice system from the moment a crime has been identified to the verdict. Students will develop the understanding and skills needed to examine information in order to review the justice of verdicts in criminal cases. In the final Mandatory unit, students will apply their understanding of awareness of criminality, criminological theories and the process of bringing an accused to court in order to evaluate the effectiveness of social control to deliver criminal justice policy.

### **Assessment**

External assessment: The following units will be externally assessed

Unit 2: Criminological Theories Unit 4: Crime and Punishment

#### Details of the external assessment are as follows:

- 90 minute exam
- 75 marks
- Three questions on each paper
- Short and extended answer questions, based on stimulus material and applied contexts.
